This is to certify Bernard Brady enlisted February 22nd 1864 from Berks County, Pa. and was mustered into the United States service in Harrisburg, Pa. as a private to serve three years or during the war in Company D 28th Regiment, Pennsylvania volunteer infantry under the command of Captain James C. Dwin and Colonel John Flynn. Comrade Brady shared the fortunes of the regiment in the following battles; Rocky Valley Ridge February 25th 1864, Resseca May 13 1864, New Hope Church May 25th, June 4th 1864 Kemesaw Mountain, June 15-30th 1864 Pine Knob, June 14th 1864 Lost Mountain, June 14th 1864 Muddy Creek, June 16th 1864 Kolb's Farm, June 22nd 1864 Marietta, July 3rd 1864 Bushy Tree Creek, July 20th 1864 The Fall of Atlanta, September 2nd 1864 Savannah, December 10-20th 1864 Raleigh and was in the hospital at Richmond Commons on account of disability. He was promoted to Corporal February 1st 1865 and to Sergeant April 1st 1865 and was honorably discharged July 18th 1865, Philadelphia on account of illness of the War.

Act of June 27, 1890.

We, J. L. Leedys and J. Campbell

of the town of Port Clinton County of Schuylkill and State of Pa do solemnly swear

that we are neighbors of Margaret Brady who is the widow of Bernard Brady deceased, on whose account she applies for Pension under the

provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890, and that for the past 40 to 40

years we have been well acquainted with the said Margaret Brady; that

from our frequent intercourse and conversations, and from other circumstances, we have every reason to believe, and we do believe, that the said Margaret Brady has not re-married

since the death of the above-mentioned Bernard Brady

FURTHER, we say that if she had re-married we have reason to believe that we should have known it.

We also believe from the knowledge we have of said widow that she neither owns nor has in use any property of any kind from which a revenue can be derived; that she has no income or present means of support than her daily labor.

at \$350.00 in which she lives and from
which she derives no income
